Available Position: Assistant Golf Instructor

SCGA Youth on Course is building a premier junior golf program in Los Angeles utilizing the Titleist Performance Institute Junior Golf Curriculum. If you have a passion for developing youth, building junior golf, and striving to be the best, this is an opportunity for you. Utilizing your experience and expertise with TPI, the LPGA and/or the PGA you will help build a program in the south east part of Los Angeles County. Supported by our team, you will assist the Program Manager and Lead Golf Instructor at three programming sites.

The Assistant Golf Instructor (herein AGI) will be responsible for assisting in the management, development, and growth of the SCGA Youth on Course instruction program, which implements the decision making curriculum and the Titleist Performance Institute's Junior Golf Curriculum. This will include assisting in the operation and teaching lessons at three program sites (Pico Rivera GC, Norwalk GC and La Mirada GC). The AGI will heavily focus his/her attention on girls programming, and engaging new and current girl golfers by developing new programs and initiatives. All outreach initiatives will be managed and led by the AGI to help achieve program and organizational goals. The AGI will work one day per week at the office and four days per week at instruction sites or remotely. The AGI will also support all other programs with a focus on having the instruction kids participate in all other program opportunities. The AGI reports to the Program Manager, Instruction, works closely with the Lead Golf Instructor, and is supported by Coach Across America coaches at the sites. The AGI also assists with development as needed and serves as a representative for the SCGA and SCGA Youth on Course to members, constituents, and the public.

Requirements:

- 1-2 years of junior golf instruction experience. Bachelor's degree (B.A.) from a four-year college or university preferred. PGA/LPGA/TPI Certification as well as playing experience strongly preferred.
- Previous work with girls programming preferred.
- Classroom management experience, and youth development training preferred.
- Demonstrated passion and expertise in sports-based youth development and junior golf.
- Must have excellent oral and written communication skills; must be detailed oriented, wellorganized, and have strong analytical and interpersonal skills.
- Ability to integrate diverse viewpoints, ideas, and opinions working with staff, Board of Directors, and industry stakeholders.
- Must be willing to learn, be a good team member, and bring a creative energy to the position.
- Proficient in using Microsoft Office and ability to learn program and fundraising software.
