PRESIDENT'S NOTE

What is our mission at SCGA Junior? For us, it's all about sports-based youth development. With your support, we can thrive within that forte and continue to change young lives through the game of golf.

Golf-based youth development is using the game to facilitate learning and life skill development in our kids. At SCGA Junior, we hook kids on the game (37,000+ rounds played last year) and use that engagement with golf to improve important characteristics like self-confidence, emotional control, leadership and connection.

As our kids learn these skills from coaches, role models and volunteers alike, we know these skills transfer to success beyond the golf course to the classroom and beyond. As the late, great Arnold Palmer said, "Success in golf depends less on strength of body than upon strength of mind and character."

We know that golf builds strong-minded kids, and with your help, SCGA Junior is significantly boosting that development by strengthening our youth development focus.

This past year was filled with a lot of excitement. The Knabe Golf Center, developed by L.A. County, reopened and is now a premier teaching facility. SCGA Junior is honored to be its primary junior program. In the first six months of the facility being open, we have seen nearly five times as much play and practice as previous years!

We also launched a college prep program to help our high schoolers be better prepared for the next steps in their education. And perhaps most fun, two of our kids had the chance to meet and learn about golf from the world's No. 1-ranked player, Dustin Johnson.

We continue to believe our role in golf is to ensure that the game is affordable to all kids. Every junior who is willing to try the game, and finds that he or she loves it, should have the opportunity to pursue it. That's what our programs are doing. From \$5 per instruction class to \$2 for a bucket of balls, SCGA Junior is growing the game every day of the year.

We have empowered more than 6,500 kids through the game of golf this year. The challenges that golf and our kids face, however are still out there. Our communities face educational, economic and healthy challenges, but with your continued participation, we are working to ensure that kids have the necessary opportunities.

The SCGA Junior Player and Youth Development program offers opportunities to learn the game of golf from certified instructors at an affordable rate. BY THE NUMBERS

- We introduced 292 kids to the game of golf at our sites and an additional 2,609 kids in the surrounding communities.
- Seventy kids had the opportunity to experience competitive play through participation in our summer and fall golf leagues and new tournament series.

SCGA Junior provides various types of resources to help our juniors get into college. In 2017, the College Prep Program was developed to teach juniors about building their resume, writing college applications and visiting campuses.

WHAT'S UP NEXT?

EQUIPMENT PROGRAM

In 2017, SCGA Junior unveiled an equipment assistance program to ensure all kids have **affordable access** to properly fitted clubs.

- 70 kids were fit in 2017. Next year, we plan to fit an additional 300 kids.

HIGH SCHOOL ASSISTANCE

We supported high school programming at three high schools, reaching 140 kids through their golf teams and P.E. classes, and look to continue expanding to other schools in SoCal.

LA CITY

SCGA Junior also took over the management of the LA City Section CIF for girls' golf, where 24 of 28 schools with golf teams are Title 1 schools. As a result, Junior will need to address roughly 2,000 female golfers who are in need of financial assistance.

GIRLS GOLF

We are planning to launch girls-specific player and youth development classes, host quarterly girls' outings and connect girls to female mentors who can share their own successes both on and off the course in 2018.

TOURNAMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

SCGA Junior wants to help level the playing field when it comes to competitive golf. By providing financial assistance to low-income families for tournament costs, juniors will be able to compete more often, helping them on their path to play at the next level. In 2018, we plan to award \$12,000 in grants for this program.




FINANCIAL SUMMARY

The SCGA underwrites all administrative and development expenses, allowing 100 percent of every dollar raised to be used for programs that directly benefit local kids.


TOTAL INCOME

community next year. In 2018, we are focused on improving our youth development model and preparing for this expansion with the initial portion of these funds.


