



PLAYER INFORMATION 2015 SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA JUNIOR AMATEUR GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP

Industry Hills Golf Club Saturday – Sunday, October 17 – 18, 2015

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. **REGISTRATION:**

All participants must check in at the SCGA/SCPGA registration table located near the parking lot near the front breezeway upon arrival on Saturday morning.

2. **STARTING TIMES AND PAIRINGS:**

Round one starting times and pairings will be e-mailed to players and posted online at scga.org/junioram one week in advance of the championship. Starting times will range from 7:30 a.m. to approximately 9:30 a.m. each day of the championship. Starting times and pairings for round two will be based on round one scores and will be available approximately one hour after the conclusion of round one.

Players are encouraged to arrive at their assigned tee well in advance of their starting time, as the SCGA/SCPGA starter will have information to discuss and distribute to each player in the group. Furthermore, players arriving late will be penalized under Rule 6-3a of the Rules of Golf. For example, the 9:00 a.m. starting time is defined as 9:00:00, and players arriving after that time are considered late. Lead groups should plan to be at their assigned tee 10 minutes in advance of their starting time. Subsequent groups are encouraged to arrive in time to watch the group in front of them tee off.

3. **FORMAT AND DIVISIONS:**

All participants will compete in a 36-hole, stroke play championship (18 holes each day). The boys will play both rounds on the Eisenhower Course, the girls will play both rounds on the Zaharias Course.

4. TEES:

Boy's Division (Eisenhower Course): Play will be from the BLUE yardage and tee markers (white yardage will be used on Hole 1, Par 4). Course Rating: 73.0 / Slope: 135 / 6,787 yards / Par 71.

Girl's Division (Zaharias Course): Play will be from the WHITE yardage and tee markers (blue yardage will be used on Holes 11 & 12, red yardage will be used on Holes 7, 10, 14 & 18). Course Rating: 76.1 / Slope: 144 / 6,009 yards / Par 71.

5. **PRACTICE ROUNDS:**

Players may make arrangements for practice rounds at their own expense. Practice Rounds can be booked up to two weeks prior to the championship. Call Industry Hills Golf Club (626-810-4653) up to seven days in advance of the date you wish to play.

Green Fee: Industry Hills' member rates will apply to those who identify themselves as a participant in the Southern California Junior Amateur Golf Championship.

6. **DRIVING RANGE:**

The driving range will be open by 6:30 a.m. on both days of the championship. Range balls will be provided complimentary on the driving range.

7. **FOOD SERVICE:**

The snack bar (as well as the Cima restaurant) will be open by 6:30 a.m. on each day of the championship. Players will be on their own for breakfast as well as any other miscellaneous food and beverage purchases.

The SCGA/SCPGA will host a player's lunch immediately following play on Saturday in the Pavilion Tent which is on the Mezzanine level of the hotel. Caddies and spectators will be on their own for all food and beverage purchases.

8. **PURCHASES:**

Cash and major credit cards will be accepted for all purchases.

CONDITIONS OF THE COMPETITION

1. RULES OF PLAY:

Play is governed by the USGA *Rules of Golf*. Local Rules in effect will be found on the SCGA Local Rules Hard Card and the Notice to Players addendum distributed at the site. Disregard all other club posted Local Rules including those on the back of the club's score card.

2. DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES AND CELL PHONES:

Distance measuring devices (without the capability of measuring slope, wind, etc.) are permitted. Players should be cautioned that some smart phones with a distance measuring application do not qualify for use due to other non-conforming applications on the phone (such as an altimeter or anemometer). The mere presence of a non-conforming feature or application disqualifies the device, even if these other features or applications are not being used. Beginning in 2014, the use of a compass is no longer a breach of the *Rules of Golf*. Any questions about such devices should be resolved before the start of the stipulated round. Otherwise, cell phone use is not permitted during the stipulated round.

3. AWARDS & TIES:

Awards will be given to the top 5 finishers within each division. In the event of a tie for 1st place only in each division, there will be a hole-by-hole playoff immediately following the conclusion of regular play. Duplicate awards will be issued for the remaining ties.

4. **AUTOMOTIVE TRANSPORTATION:**

Golf carts are prohibited during the championship. All players, caddies and spectators must walk.

5. **PULL OR PUSH CARTS**:

Pull or push carts are permitted; however, the club does not rent them.

6. **CADDIES**:

Players may provide their own caddie (See section 4 on Automotive Transportation). Caddies must adhere to the dress code listed in section 8 below. A player may not use a parent, step parent, or guardian as a caddie during the championship proper.

7. **SPECTATORS**:

Spectators are permitted but are not allowed in carts. Spectators must remain on cart paths at all times adhere to all policies set forth by the club.

8. **DRESS CODE:**

Players and caddies must be properly attired in golf shirts, slacks, Bermuda-length dress or golf shorts and soft spike shoes. Jeans (any color or any kind), T-shirts and tank tops will not be permitted. Shirts must be tucked in and hats are to be worn forward at all times.

9. PLAYER CODE OF CONDUCT:

By submitting an entry for any SCGA/SCPGA-administered competition, the contestant understands that his/her participation is at the sole discretion of the SCGA/SCPGA. A contestant may be removed from any competition at the discretion of the SCGA/SCPGA staff or Rules and Competitions Committee at any time before or during the competition. Incidents of unbecoming conduct or actions deemed to be detrimental to the image of the SCGA/SCPGA or the "Spirit of the Game" are grounds for such removal and suspension from future SCGA/SCPGA-administered competitions. These include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Willful damage of the golf course or golf course property
- Club throwing or unnecessary club tossing
- Offensive or unbecoming language
- Public criticism of golf course or verbal abuse of SCGA/SCPGA staff, officials, volunteers, host club staff or other contestants
- Potential endangerment of others
- Conduct deemed unbecoming
- Failure to post scores for handicapping purposes
- Manipulation of scores posted for handicapping purposes

10. **CANCELLATIONS:**

To withdraw for any reason prior to the start of an SCGA competition, a player must notify the SCGA Rules and Competitions Department at (818) 980-3630, or by clicking here.

If a player needs to withdraw on the morning of the event, notify the SCGA/SCPGA staff person through the golf shop staff at the host venue. Failure to notify the SCGA/SCPGA will subject the player to suspension from future SCGA/SCPGA competitions.
