Should be used for trophies, certificates and when space is limited on websites..

Think of this version as the official stamp of the SCGA.





SCGA Logo - Colors

 Here's some help when it comes to logo color options. Be mindful of the background. We want SCGA to standout! All options are available for download at scga.org/media.





When using the logo on blue background, the logo must be white and 30% gray



When using the logo on 50%K or lighter gray, the logo must be pantone 548:90% with white



When using the logo on white background, the logo must be pantone 548:90% with 51%K



When using the logo on 50%K or darker, the logo must be white with 30%K



Email/Newsletter Messaging

- We love when clubs include SCGA messaging in club emails and newsletters. In fact, we encourage it! Clubs are our best marketers, so please feel free to share:
 - SCGA Tournament schedules
 - SCGA Outings and Event news
 - Website information, etc.
- However, we want to avoid any confusion about WHO the email is coming from.
 When we talk to your members, we let them know it's the SCGA. When you talk to your members, we want them to know it is their club talking to them!
- To help with this, please refrain from including SCGA in the name of an email address.
 For instance, scga@golfclub.com could be confusing. Instead, use membership@golfclub.com.
